Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Statement of standalone financial results of **Sheraton Properties & Finance Limited** ('the Company') for the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2023 ('the Statement'), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosures Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ('the Regulations').
